(SHE is suddenly possessed by all three sisters at once.)

This morning I woke up, and the sunlight beamed through my soul. I had a passionate longing to go-yes, that one dream, the only dream, it grows stronger and stronger- To Moscow! Yes my darling Irinachka, we shall go home to Moscow. And Masha will spend her summers with us. But Olya, sometimes it seems- yes my little sister, don't fret- but sometimes it seems that life, yes every day life is slipping by, and sometimes it seems that we shall never go to Moscow!

But today, yes today I am so happy. No it's just foolishness! I am not destined to go!* So be it! What can one do, but sit like Gogol's madman.

(SHE suddenly snaps out of it.)

You see, I finally got this incredible audition.
